



St Ippolyts C.E. (Aided) Primary School

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Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) September 2016

Pupil Premium is awarded to schools for the number of children who have been eligible for free school meals at any point in the last six years. Pupil Premium is also allocated to Children Looked After and post-looked after.

At St Ippolyts Primary School PPG Funding is used in the following ways:

- Provision of additional Teaching Assistants across the school to provide intervention and support for individuals and small groups.
- Additional TA support for pupil well-being and social skills: nurture groups, circle of friends, motor skills sessions, one to one pupil mentoring
- Training and courses for Teachers and TAs
- Additional support materials and resources for example, reading books for reluctant readers
- Personalised resources for individual pupils matched to need
- Subsidised or fully funded trips and activities enabling all children to have full access to the curriculum and enrichment opportunities: for example, swimming lessons, school trips, residential school journey, after school clubs
- Provision of holiday club activities for pupils during school holidays
- Purchase of laptops to enable UKS2 pupils to complete homework electronically
- Uniform grants

2015 - 2016

For the academic year 2015 – 2016 St Ippolyts School funding for Pupil Premium was £15,840.00 and total spend was £21,460.00

The progress and attainment of pupils eligible for PPG are tracked and monitored individually. All eligible pupils receive tailored interventions as detailed on the termly year group Action Plans.

Some pupils also have additional barriers to learning or multiple vulnerabilities. For example, of the 10 PPG eligible pupils in 2015-2016, 8 also were identified on the SEND register for moderate learning needs, Specific Learning Difficulties (Dyslexia), Autistic Spectrum and Attachment Disorder. Some pupils in receipt of PPG also have English as an Additional Language.

2015-2016 Outcomes:

- School tracking and assessment evidences that PPG Pupils in KS2 made more bands of progress in all subjects (Reading, Writing, Mathematics, Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling) in every year group, than their non-PPG peers. This shows that interventions and support are effective in diminishing within-school differences.
- School tracking and assessment evidences that PPG Pupils in KS1 made similar bands of progress in all subjects (Reading, Writing, Mathematics, Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling) in every year group, to their non-PPG peers. These pupils will receive increased support in KS2.

2016 - 2017

For the academic year 2016 – 2017 St Ippolyts School funding for Pupil Premium is £20,960

Funding will be used in the ways listed above to support pupil progress and attainment and to continue interventions to diminish differences.

Each child is identified on their year group Action Plan with personalised learning programmes and their progress and development monitored by the Inclusion Coordinator and Senior Leaders.

In addition, for 2016-2017, part of the funding has been allocated to appoint additional support staff hours in the Early Years and Key Stage One classes due to growing numbers of pupils eligible for PPG in these year groups.
