CURRICULUM INFORMATION Summer 2018

Class 3

ENGLISH: Our topics will be based on explanations, recounts, adventure stories and poetry.

Writing:

- Punctuate single clause sentences and multi-clause sentences using coordinating conjunctions mostly accurately
- Uses sentence with different forms: statement, question, exclamation, command
- Expands sentences using co-ordination (using *or, and, but*) and subordination (using *when, if, that, because*)
- Use expanded noun phrases to describe and specify
- Use both familiar and new punctuation correctly most of the time, including full stops, capital letters, exclamation marks, question marks, commas for lists and apostrophes for contracted forms and the possessive (singular)

Reading:

- Identify words and phrases that link events
- Refer back to the text for evidence
- Retrieve information stated within text
- Recognise that information is grouped according to subject

MATHS

- Fractions - Compare fractions and different quantities of amounts e.g. $\frac{1}{4}$ of £20 = £5
- Measures - compare equivalents of mixed units e.g. ml to l
- Addition and subtraction using the column method up to 3 digits with carrying and borrowing
- Tell and write the time from an analogue clock, including using Roman numerals from I to XII, and 12-hour and 24-hour clocks
- Solve worded problems involving all four functions; addition, subtraction, multiplication and division
- Present and compare data in various ways e.g. bar charts recognise, line graph
- Draw 2-D shapes and make 3-D shapes using modelling materials; 3-D shapes in different orientations and describe them
- Identify horizontal and vertical lines and pairs of perpendicular and parallel lines
- Identify right angles, recognise that two right angles make a half-turn, three make three quarters of a turn and four a complete turn; identify whether angles are greater than or less than a right angle

SCIENCE

Animals including Humans:

- Describe how humans and animals grow
- Describe the basic needs of humans and animals
- Healthy and unhealthy foods
- Importance of exercise and hygiene

Light:

- Investigate; light and dark, shadows, reflective materials, materials that block light

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Worship:

- Learn about what worship is, how people worship, where people worship and why.
- Think about how we use worship in our daily lives.

Islam:

- Learn about what Muslims believe, where they worship, what festivals they celebrate and sign and symbols that are important to them.

COMPUTING

Our topic this term is 'Visual Information', we will be learning;

- To create a database in various ways such as pictograms, bar charts using the computer.
- To analyse data and information.

HUMANITIES (History/Geography)

Our topic this half term is 'World War One and Two', we will be learning;

- The animals in the war
- Women on the Home Front
- Role and responsibilities of the Armed Forces
- Life on the Front Line
- The Battle of Britain

After half term our topic will be ' ', we will be leaning about;

Art:

- Sunset Art using Ink, cave paintings, African College Mask with Papier Mache, Maasai Jewellery

Design Technology:

- Make, design and test food to make sandwiches

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Athletics

- Learn different running, throwing and jumping skills

Games - Rounders and cricket

- Practice how to throw and catch effectively.
- Learn how to cooperativity field.
- Learn how to strike a ball using different equipment and in an intended direction
- Play simplified versions of rounders and cricket.

MUSIC

- Explore how to make different sounds by the weather, animals and the body.

After half term our topic will be 'Instruments', we will be leaning about;

- Different instruments and perform together.

PSHE&C (Personal, social, health education, and citizenship)

Growing and changing:

- Think about how our responsibilities and skills change as we grown, learn how we change from young to old, and think about how our needs have changed.

Healthy lifestyles:

- Learn what makes a balanced diet, what food portions we should have, why hygiene is important and how we can make our days healthy.
