HOW TO USE THIS GRID

Over this half term, **choose 6 activities** from the boxes below. You need to choose at least one English and one Maths activity, the rest are up to you.

You can complete the activities whenever you want over the half term so long as you have done at least 6 by the end of the half term.

When you have completed one of the tasks, bring it into school to display on the Home Learning wall. You could earn house points for home learning too!

WEEKLY HOME LEARNING

On **Tuesdays**, you will receive a set of spellings to learn and a piece of English or Maths to do.

Your piece of homework is due in and your spellings will be tested on the following **Monday**, which means you have a whole week and a weekend to do it.

DAILY READING AND TIMES TABLES

Read every day at home, with an adult. Discuss what you have read and record your reading in the diary. Remember to explore any new vocabulary you come across too.

Practise your number bonds to 10 and 20, just a few minutes a day to learn them by heart.

ENGLISH

- Write 5 questions that you would have liked to ask Guy Fawkes.
- Write 5 facts about bonfire night.
- Read your favourite book and create a book review.

MATHS

- Count in 2s, 5s and 10s. Write these down to 20, 50 or 100.
- Go around your house and find different 2D shapes, can you draw a picture of each one and write down its shape.
- Measure with a ruler 5 items that you find in your home in cm.

SCIENCE

- Complete/ create a seasons wheel (sheet attached).

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

- Write about and draw a picture to show why Christians celebrate Christmas.

COMPUTING

- On the computer programme paint, create a picture using different colours and brushes.

HUMANITIES (History/Geography)

- Create a poster or a piece of writing to show me everything you know about Guy Fawkes.

ART / DESIGN

- Create a firework night picture.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- Make up a firework dance and show it to your grown-ups. You can send it on an email for us to see in class.

MUSIC

- Listen to some fireworks and write the different sounds that you hear.
