HOW TO USE THIS GRID

Over this half term, **choose 4 activities** from the boxes below. You need to choose at least one English and one Maths activity, the rest are up to you. You can complete the activities whenever you want over the half term so long as you have done at least 6 by the end of the half term.

When you have completed one of the tasks, bring it into school to display on the Home Learning wall. You could earn house points for home learning too!

WEEKLY HOME LEARNING

On **Tuesdays** you will receive a set of spellings to learn and a piece of English or Maths to do. Your piece of homework is due in and your spellings will be tested on the following **Monday**, which means you have a whole week and a weekend to do it.

DAILY READING AND TIMES TABLES

Read every day at home, with an adult. Discuss what you have read and record your reading in the diary. These will be checked every Monday. Practise your times tables too, just a few minutes a day to learn them by heart.
Year 3 - 3s, 4s, and 8s. Year 4 - 6s, 7s, and 9s.

ENGLISH

- Think about your favourite place you have ever visited, use this to write a descriptive story setting. Use a key and underline adverbs, fronted adverbials, alliteration, onomatopoeia and any other techniques you can think of.
- Write a set of instructions for your recipe. Don't forget to use time adverbials and imperative verbs.
- Create a fun and interesting board game that helps you practise your spellings!

MATHS

- Separate an item of clothing into different colours (or any other categories you can think of!) and write these as fractions of the total amounts and add them together.
- Plan and research a day trip for the Easter holidays. Calculate the cost and price of everything you will need! Think about how you will get there and how many people.
- Find two and three digit numbers around your house. Multiply these together and show your workings.

SCIENCE

- Can you create a drawing and label it to show the forces that are used? Compare it to another diagram of a different object.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

- Write a poem for our value of this term. I'd like to display these in our reflection area. Try to think about your presentation.

COMPUTING

- Collect a coding sheet from Miss Gale, select characters and create a code that could work on the laptops!

HUMANITIES (History/Geography)

- Write an adventure story about two travellers who journey through a rainforest!

ART / DESIGN

- Create your favourite family recipe. How can you record it? Perhaps create a story board with photographs or drawings.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- Create a picture of a 'healthy dinner'. Think about each category of food and how much of each you need to have to create a balanced diet! Display this how you wish.

MUSIC

- Listen to a piece of classical music and write a list of the instruments you can hear. Write about how the piece of music makes you feel.

PSHE&C

- Write a play script about children a situation where children need to use learning powers. Perhaps you could practice and perform it with some friends or siblings.
