HOW TO USE THIS GRID

Over this half term, **choose 4 activities** from the boxes below. You need to choose at least one English and one Maths activity, the rest are up to you. You can complete the activities whenever you want over the half term so long as you have done at least 4 by the end of the half term.

When you have completed one of the tasks, bring it into school to display on the Home Learning wall. You could earn house points for home learning too!

WEEKLY HOME LEARNING

On **Tuesdays** you will receive a set of spellings to learn and a piece of English or Maths to do.
Your piece of homework is due in and your spellings will be tested on the following **Monday**, which means you have a whole week and a weekend to do it.

DAILY READING AND TIMES TABLES

Read every day at home, with an adult. Discuss what you have read and record your reading in the diary. These will be checked every Monday.
Practise your times tables too, just a few minutes a day to learn them by heart.
Year 3 - 3s, 4s, and 8s. Year 4 - 6s, 7s, and 9s.

ENGLISH

- Write a diary entry from the viewpoint of someone other than yourself. Perhaps a favourite book character or someone from a game.
- Write a discussion with your opinion on 'School should start at 10am so children can have a lie in. But then, school will finish at 5:30pm'.
- Research a famous poet, perhaps you could rehearse one of their poems.

MATHS

- Practise your timetables every day for a week and record how you did it, when you did it and how you now feel about your timetables. Maybe you can invent a new game.
- Complete a survey of your friends and family answering the question "What is your favourite day of the week?" Record the results in a graph.
- Complete some multiplication and division sums with 2 and 3 digit numbers

SCIENCE

- Organise and classifying objects around your home.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

- Research and create a visual representation of how Hindus celebrate religious festivals

COMPUTING.

- Use Microsoft Word to type and present one of these pieces of homework.

HUMANITIES (History/Geography)

- Choose a team - Ancient Greece or Ancient Rome? Create a piece of writing that persuades a historian on your view point.

ART / DESIGN

- Research another famous artist. Create an information text about their life and pieces of work
- Recreate a piece of famous art work in any medium you wish.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- Practise your throwing and catching skills. Create a rally and record your scores, what is the longest rally you could get?

MUSIC.

- Practise the songs or raps from our music lessons, could you perform them without the words?
