## HOW TO USE THIS GRID

Over this half term, **choose 5 activities** from the boxes below. You need to choose at least one English and one Maths activity, the rest are up to you.

You can complete the activities whenever you want over the half term so long as you have done at least 5 by the end of the half term.

When you have completed one of the tasks, bring it into school to display on the Home Learning wall. You could earn house points for home learning too!

## WEEKLY HOME LEARNING

On **Tuesdays** you will receive a set of spellings to learn and a piece of English or Maths to do.

Your piece of homework is due in and your spellings will be tested on the following **Monday**, which means you have a whole week and a weekend to do it.

## DAILY READING AND TIMES TABLES

**Read every day at home, with an adult.** Discuss what you have read and record your reading in the diary. Remember to explore any new vocabulary you come across too. 15-20 mins a day.

Practise your times tables too, just a few minutes a day to learn them by heart.

### ENGLISH

- Take a scene from a chapter of 'Private Peaceful' and write a script for a radio drama.
- Draw a cartoon story about keeping safe on the Internet or Cyberbullying. Use speech bubbles as well as narration.
- Poetry – See if you can create your own poem based on WW1, drawing upon figurative language features.
- Research and make an informative poster about remembrance/British Legion
- Using your learning powers present a review about the performance of 'Private Peaceful'.

### MATHS

- Find out some of the measuring units used in WW1 time. Display your findings in an interesting way.
- Design a board game based on the Mayans or WW1 using numbered squares. Create small cards that test other areas of maths: times tables/shape/money/measure.
- Measure and follow a recipe accurately to make a War Time dish (sweet or savoury). Take a picture of your creation.
- Draw a diagram of a trench using various views. Ariel/side view.
- Make a display board showing rationing amounts in WW1.

### SCIENCE

- Make a short video/ powerpoint presentation about Carl Linnaeus describing his classification system.
- Draw a detailed diagram and explain what a micro-organism is.

### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

- Find out about the parts of a Cathedral or church and show your learning using your learning powers.
- Write a prayer of remembrance.
- Research the different faith groups that took part in WW1.

### COMPUTING

- Create a poster explaining how data can be stored.
- Keep a track of your digital footprint for a week.

### HUMANITIES (Geography)

- Research information about an area from The Mayans.
- Design and create a wordsearch or crossword about the Mayans. You need to supply the answers too.

### ART / DESIGN

- Make a Wartime dish and write out the recipe to share.
- Draw and create using different media, a card to celebrate the 100yrs of the WW1 ending.

### PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- Choreograph a dance of your choice Teach a small section to the class in one of our lessons.
- Make up a playleader game ready to try out on the playground.

### MUSIC

- Try to listen to some WW1 songs. What would your top 10 be? Explain why you like or dislike each song.
- Have a go at writing a song about advent or Christmas.

### PSHE&C (Personal, social, health education, and citizenship)

- Can you make a leaflet about Truthfulness.
- Make a ppt to show what children can do to promote mental well-being.
