HOW TO USE THIS GRID

Over this half term, **choose 6 activities** from the boxes below. You need to choose at least one English and one Maths activity, the rest are up to you.

You can complete the activities whenever you want over the half term so long as you have done at least 6 by the end of the half term.

When you have completed one of the tasks, bring it into school to display on the Home Learning wall. You could earn house points for home learning too!

WEEKLY HOME LEARNING

On **Tuesdays**, you will receive a set of spellings to learn and a piece of English or Maths to do.

Your piece of homework is due in and your spellings will be tested on the following **Monday**, which means you have a whole week and a weekend to do it.

DAILY READING AND TIMES TABLES

Read every day at home, with an adult. Discuss what you have read and record your reading in the diary. Remember to explore any new vocabulary you come across too. Practise your number bonds to 10 and 20, just a few minutes a day to learn them by heart.

ENGLISH

- Write 3 sentences to tell me about what you did during the Christmas holidays.
- Samuel Pepys was famous for keeping a diary during the Great Fire of London. Write a few sentences to tell me what you get up to during a weekend.
- Samuel Pepys hid his cheese during the Great Fire of London. What item would you hide and why?

MATHS

- Follow a cake/ biscuit recipe together with a grown up, take a photo of you measuring out the different ingredients. You could bring a piece in for the adults in our class to try.
- Practise telling the time with a grown up at home.
- Create a map with a list of directions that someone during the great fire of London could have used to escape to the river. Remember to the correct vocabulary (clockwise, anti-clockwise, quarter, half and 3 quarter turn).

SCIENCE

- Draw and label a picture of your favourite plant.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

- Write a prayer about our new value, service.

COMPUTING

- Use the computer to practise your phonics on phonics play (phase 4 and 5).

HUMANITIES (History/Geography)

- Find out some facts about the Great Fire of London.

ART / DESIGN

- Create a picture showing a scene from the Great Fire of London. You could draw, paint, collage or use chalks to create your picture.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- Create a warm up that we could use in one of our PE lessons.

MUSIC

- Listen to your favourite song and clap the rhythm you hear.

PSHE&C (Personal, social, health education, and citizenship)

- Make a poster to show the qualities you need to be a good friend.
